Our School

Established in 1926, Northcote High School has built a rich tradition of academic excellence, dedicated innovative teaching, quality facilities and caring student support. We preserve this core and stimulate progress through our widely acclaimed Music, Science, Art & Design and Sporting programs.

The school's extensive academic, co-curricular and pastoral care programs encourage students to develop their own educational pathways and explore individual interests with opportunities to participate in Public Speaking, Debating, Coding, chess Clubs, Public Art Projects and many more.

Students are supported by award-winning teachers and have access to modern facilities including library, Performance & Visual Arts Centre, Design & Technology centre, outdoor sports centre and gymnasium. A purpose-built centre caters for the international program specifically and other facilities such as senior study centre, student wellbeing centre and computer facilities throughout the school ensuring international students are well supported.

Local Environment

Northcote High School is situated at the southern end of the City of Darebin, on St Georges Road, Northcote. A tram service operates from the front of the school and the train station is only a five minute walk away. The location of the school is a drawcard for many families considering enrolment.

Northcote is an inner suburb of Melbourne, Victoria, 6 km northeast of Melbourne's Central Business District. It is a suburb with a village vibe, where older Greek and Italian residents live alongside artists, musicians and young families. It's a hub for live music, with shows at Northcote Social Club and the intimate Uniting Church. Innovative eateries and bars, plus shops selling designer goods, line High Street and spread into neighbouring Thornbury. The Westgarth Theatre shows movies in art-deco surrounds. Northcote has a huge variety of recreation facilities and sports clubs for residents and visitors to enjoy, catering to all interests.

Learning Resources

In Year 10 students choose from a range of different courses enabling them to further customise their learning experience, to challenge and extend themselves or to embed skills in particular learning areas. The Year 10 program in conjunction with year 9 is known as The Northcote Model.

In Years 11 and 12 students study the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) and we offer a broad range of subjects that students can select from. It is common for students who have demonstrated good learning behaviours to advance by undertaking a VCE unit in Year 10. Students can also elect, as part of either program, to study a Vocational Education and Training (VET) subject. NHS has very successful partnerships with external VET providers as well as offering some on campus.

For year 10, 11 & 12 booklist, we will support students to purchase books when they commence school.

Each learner at Northcote High School has access to a portable, networked digital device, such as a notebook, macbook or tablet that connects each learner with their teacher and other learners or experts, multimedia resources, software for learning and online tools and applications. Information and Communication Technology (ICT) is delivered to students across all their subjects. Through the use of a range of software, students develop an understanding of how these can be applied to various activities undertaken in and beyond the classroom.

All students at NHS must have a 1:1 device. Students in Years 10-12 may chose the device they bring in accordance with the minimum specifications set out by the school. Please refer to the attached Bring our Own Device Requirement. For all students the device will be family owned. Some support will be provided by the IT team at school, but any damage, viruses, technical or insurance issues will be managed at home.

Online Communications Environments

Northcote High School has two major portals that are used to communicate information to students and families:

- Compass is a portal that allows families to stay informed about what their child is involved in at the school. Through Compass parents and students can pay for excursions, approve attendance at school events, book parent teacher interview times, stay up to date with important school news through a "newsfeed", email teachers and see the student's timetable.
- ❖ Teams is a Learning Management System (Accessed through Compass) that allows students to interact with teachers, peers and resources to enhance their learning. Students can gain access to work, digital resources (videos, quizzes, and web-links) and assessment tasks that are specific to each of their subjects. Students and families also have access to a calendar that shows upcoming due work and school events that they are connected to.
- Most importantly COMPASS is the portal where students and families receive feedback on assessment tasks; in terms of achievement and areas for improvement.

Extra-curriculum activities

Our exciting programs include: Music, Sport, Debating, Visual Arts, Performing Arts, Duke of Edinburgh program and NHS Green, which means there's just about something for everyone to enable them to realise their potential.
